ABOUT THE HIV NEEDS ASSESSMENT SURVEY

- Conducted every 3 years in Florida
 - The last one was done in 2013
- Required by the federal government


PROMOTIONAL FLYER AND BUSINESS CARD

○ Flyer


- About ¼ of a standard sheet of paper
- To be distributed and left out with other brochures at CHD, other DOH facilities, CBOs, health care providers' offices, etc.

○ Business card

- Standard business card size; fits in wallet
- Does not reference HIV
- To be given to people who have had the survey explained to them
- To be given to those who do not want to carry around anything that makes reference to HIV
