## **Does Your Patient Have Challenges Taking Their ART?**

- > Are they living with HIV?
- > Are they 15-24 years of age?
- Do they have a viral load of ≥200 copies/mL?

## If so, refer them to the SMART study!

## We are recruiting for a study to support youth struggling with adherence and maintaining a suppressed viral load.



- Your patient will receive a daily text message reminder or a phone call from an adherence facilitator each weekday to support them in taking their ART.
- Patients will be randomized to receive either the text message reminder or the phone call.
- With your patient's permission, our adherence facilitator will contact your clinical team if they are having problems with taking their ART (e.g., insurance issue).



- Our adherence facilitator will support your patient to contact your clinical team for other issues such as homelessness, substance use, and other challenges that might make ART adherence difficult.
- If eligible for SMART, your patient could also **receive up to \$200** for their participation.
