



Miami-Dade County Project P.E.A.C.E.

"People Engaged and Advocating for Community Empowerment"

Project PEACE is a 3-year, \$1 million grant initiative funded by the U.S. Department of Justice, Community-Based Crime Reduction (CBCR) Program. The grant is administered by the Miami-Dade County Office of Management and Budget - Grants Coordination Division in Collaboration with Miami-Dade Police Department (Lead Law Enforcement Agency), and Justice & Security Strategies, Inc. (Research Partner), various Cross-Sector Partners, and residents.

The research partner is conducting surveys in the target area to obtain resident and community member input for use in developing the crime reduction strategies. Door-to-door surveys provide critical information to gain a better understanding and fully assess the needs of the community.

Job Description

Justice and Security Strategies, Inc. (JSS) through Project P.E.A.C.E. is seeking individuals who live in or near unincorporated Miami-Dade County **South** of SW 200th Street to work as surveyors for the project. The applicant must be able to communicate in English and/or Spanish and be professional. It is preferred that the applicant be knowledgeable about the South – Miami-Dade County area. All accepted candidates must complete a four-hour, in person training at a designated location prior to serving as a surveyor for this project. The surveyor will be paid at a rate of \$30 per completed and validated survey.

Knowledge, Abilities and Skills

Ability to travel to the assigned Target Area. Ability to show dependability and responsibility in carrying out and completing surveys. Ability to relate well to team members, supervisors, residents, and others related to the program.

Basic Requirements

- Must pass a criminal background check
- Minimum 21 years old
- Able to conduct door-to-door outdoor surveys interviews in Unincorporated Miami-Dade County South of SW 200th Street
- Must be a resident or work in or very near the target area (South) at the time of hire

Physical Demands

The physical demands described are representative of those that must be met by an independent contractor completing surveys in a specified location. Job responsibilities include picking up work materials/surveys and returning completed surveys to the immediate supervisor. Independent contractors must be able to schedule their work times successfully surveys within the assigned time period. Surveys must be conducted by engaging residents in a door-to-door/in-person fashion.
