



EHE Community Engagement Funding Notice

The purpose of this announcement is to notify the community of recent funding awarded to Community Based Organizations (CBOs) for the competitive application process of the *EHE Community Engagement Funding Opportunity*. The Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) is a national initiative that supports areas across the US which face high rates of new HIV cases. This initiative, led locally by the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade (DOH-MD) and the Miami-Dade Ryan White Part A Program, will help significantly reduce HIV rates across the county. The goal of EHE is to reduce new HIV cases by 75% in 5 years, and by 90% in 10 years.

In partnership with DOH-MD, the Health Council of South Florida (HCSF) is overseeing this EHE Community Engagement process. Agencies funded through this EHE Community Engagement will improve local HIV prevention and treatment systems by completing activities that are based on four pillars:

- **Diagnose** all people with HIV as early as possible
- **Treat** people with HIV rapidly and effectively to reach sustained viral suppression
- **Prevent** new HIV transmissions by using proven interventions including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPS)
- **Respond** quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment to people who need them
