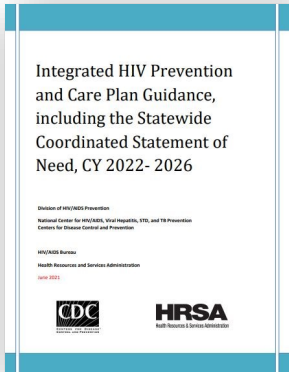

World AIDS Day was first observed in 1988. Each year, organizations and individuals across the world bring attention to the HIV epidemic, endeavor to increase HIV awareness and knowledge, speak out against HIV stigma, and call for an increased response to move toward Ending the HIV Epidemic in the US.

World AIDS Day 2021

HIV Around the World¹⁾

HIV continues to be a major global public health issue, having claimed more than 36 million lives so far. In 2020, 688,000 people died from HIV-related causes globally. There were approximately 38 million people living with HIV (PLWH) at the end of 2020 with 1.5 million people becoming newly infected in 2020 globally.

75% of adults and 84% of adolescents living with HIV were receiving lifelong antiretroviral therapy (ART) in 2020.

It is estimated that currently only 84% of people with HIV know their status. In 2020, 27.2 million people living with HIV were receiving ART globally.

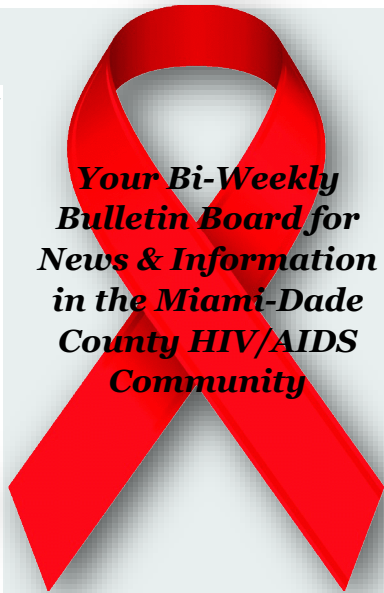

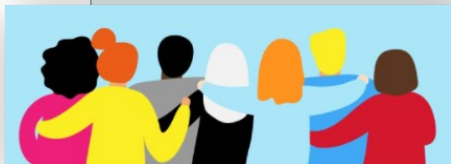

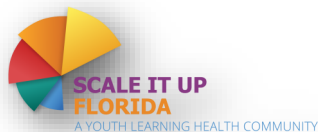
