### Intersection of Intimate Partner Violence and HIV in Women

(CDC.gov) Exposure to Intimate Partner Violence can increase women's risk for HIV through forced sex with an infected partner; limited or compromised negotiation of safer sex practices; increased sexual risk-taking behaviors.
