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

I. Business Items

Call to Order/Introductions

Committee Chair, Sannita Vaughn, called the roundtable to order at 12:04 p.m. In-person attendees introduced themselves and staff read the names of Zoom participants.

Resource Persons

Ms. Vaughn recognized Behavioral Science Research Corp. (BSR) staff as the resource person for today's roundtable.

Floor Open to the Public

Ms. Vaughn opened the floor to the public with the following statement:

"Pursuant to Florida Sunshine Law, I want to provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to be heard on any item on our agenda today. If there is anyone who wishes to be heard, I invite you to speak now. Each person will be given three minutes to speak. Please begin by stating your name and address for the record before you talk about your concerns. BSR has a dedicated telephone line as well as a general email

address for statements to be read into the record. No statements were received via the telephone line or email."

There were no comments; the floor was then closed.

Review Agenda

The committee reviewed the agenda. There were no changes.

Review the Minutes of November 29, 2021

Members reviewed the November 29, 2021 meeting minutes. There were no changes.

Membership

Members were given a folder with the Membership Report; Member Recruitment Campaign; and application for the Community Coalition and the Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership. Members were asked to review all the materials prior to the next meeting and, if possible, bring a new applicant with a completed application.

Partnership Member Application Review

Staff received two applications for Partnership membership: 1) Alecia Tramel for the *Non-Elected Community Leader/Not an HIV Provider* seat; and 2) John Frazier for a *Representative of the Affected Community, not affiliated or employed by a Ryan White Program Part A funded service provider and receiving one or more Ryan White Program Part A services* seat. Both candidates were present, introduced themselves and stated their interest in joining the planning council.

Members completed Applicant Score Sheets for each candidate, staff tallied the results, and both candidates were put forward for recommendation:

Motion to recommend to the Mayor of Miami-Dade County the appointment to the Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership of Alecia Tramel in the Non-Elected Community Leader, Not an HIV Provider seat.

Moved: Luigi Ferrer Seconded: Sandra Jones Motion: Passed

Motion to recommend to the Mayor of Miami-Dade County the appointment to the Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership of James Frazier for the seat: Representative of the Affected Community, not affiliated or employed by a Ryan White Program Part A funded service provider and receiving one or more Ryan White Program Part A services.

Moved: Alecia Tramel Seconded: Lamar McMullen Motion: Passed

Election of Officers

Per the Partnership Bylaws, elections of Chair and Vice Chair are to take place in January of each year. Due to meeting cancellations, the schedule was delayed one month. Members put forward their names as nominees: Alecia Tramel for Chair and Lamar McMullen for Vice Chair. After some discussion, no other

nominees were named. Members voted on the slate of candidates:

Motion to elect Alecia Tramel as Community Coalition Chair and Lamar McMullen as Community Coalition Vice Chair.

Moved: Luigi Ferrer Seconded: Alberto Perez Bermudez Motion: Passed

The new officers were welcomed with special thanks to outgoing Chair Sannita Vaughn.

II. Roundtable

Review of Committee Feedback on Roundtable Items

Staff advised that most committees have not met to review the Roundtable Feedback; this item was tabled.

Special Presentation: Language Matters When Ending the Epidemic: Redefining the New Norms

Ms. Vaughn, Ms. Tramel, Mr. McMullen, and Alesia McPhaul presented *Language Matters When Ending the Epidemic: Redefining the New Norms*, and led a question, answer, and feedback session. The presentation covered perception, words, and language related to HIV and people with HIV; why language we use around HIV matters; stigmatizing language and how to rephrase conversations around HIV; and the importance of People First language. The presenters urged participants to speak up whenever they hear misinformation or stigmatizing language, and to understand their surroundings and their audience to be able to convey empowering language in an inclusive way.

General Discussion

A question was raised regarding incentives to bring in new members. Staff advised cash or gift card incentives are not effective to increase membership because once a person becomes a member, they can no longer receive incentives.

Members asked about how materials could be made available in Spanish and Creole to include a larger audience.

Announcements

Several National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day events were announced hosted by Pridelines, Empower U, Inc., and Positive People Network. Several food distribution events were promoted through the Partnership's social media accounts.

Positive People Network and the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County announced job openings. People with HIV are given priority and are encouraged to apply to all positions.

Positive People Network is looking for members for their Community Advisory Board.

Next Roundtable

Members were asked to consider going back to alternating lunch and dinner meetings in off-site locations. Staff noted that holding meetings at off-site locations is challenging due to COVID-19 restrictions at provider agencies and the A/V set up required to conduct meetings in-person and via Zoom. Members were asked to advise staff of possible alternate locations.

Staff advised the United Way Ansin Building is no longer financially viable as a meeting site, and the Miami-Dade Public Library does not allow food in the meeting room.

Ms. Vaughn called for a motion to adjourn.

Community Coalition

1. Motion to recommend to the Mayor of Miami-Dade County the appointment to the Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership of Alecia Tramel for the Non-Elected Community Leader/Not an HIV Provider seat.

Care and Treatment

- 2. Motion to recommend addition of Florida ADAP Formulary medications (September 2021) to the Ryan White Prescription Drugs Formulary, with:
 - a. Adding a notation to naltrexone indicating it is only the oral formulation; and
 - b. Not adding #8, sofosbuvir/velpatasvir, and #9, sofosbuvir/velpatasvir/ voxilaprevir to the formulary.

3. Motion to:

- a. Accept changes to the Miami-Dade County Ryan White Program Minimum Primary Medical Care Standards;
- b. Accept the changes to the Oral Health Care service description, as presented in;
- c. Accept the Mental Health service description;
- d. Accept the Substance Abuse service description; and
- e. Accept the changes to the Oral Health service standards.
- 4. Motion to include pregnancy as an allowable medical condition, and add obstetrics to the *genitourinary/gynecology* specialty on the RWP Allowable Medical Conditions List.
- 5. Motion to accept the Medical Case Management, Including Treatment Adherence service description as presented, with minor revision:
 - a. Keep, "at least every 6 months";
 - b. Remove language on closures;
 - c. Remove Provide System statement;
 - d. Remove green highlighted language, "in conjunction with the client's recertification," on page 55; and
 - e. Include language "as may be amended via formal written notification from the Recipient."

6. Motion to accept the changes to the Health Insurance and Medical Transportation service descriptions.



2020 Ryan White Program Client Satisfaction Survey

- FY 2020 was the 13th Ryan White Client Satisfaction Survey (CSS) administered by Behavioral Science Research (BSR)
- Previous surveys were conducted in 2006 and annually since 2008
- 325 client interviews were completed, focusing on four core service categories:
 - Medical Case Management
 - Outpatient Ambulatory Health Services
 - AIDS Pharmaceutical Assistance
 - Oral Health Care
- Survey was truncated because of COVID-19 service impacts







Survey Methodology in the Year of COVID-19

- Clients were interviewed by telephone, rather than in-person interviews at subrecipient Medical Case Management sites, as BSR had done in the past.
 - The interviews were quota-sampled by MCM site, based on the number of clients case-managed at the site. Clients must have been in RWP MCM care at the site for at least 6 months.
 - Clients were recruited to participate in two ways:
 - by MCMs, from a randomized list of clients receiving MCM services at the site, and who gave permission for BSR to conduct the interview before BSR could contact them;
 - by BSR directly, from a randomized list of the site's clients who had previously-executed "Consent to be Contacted by BSR for Future Research" form in their Provide records.
- As an incentive to participate, clients were given a \$25 Walmart "e-gift" card, by phone text, by email or sent by US mail.

Major Client Satisfaction Survey (CSS) findings to keep in mind ...

- Demographics of the 2020 CSS sample generally matched the ethnicity/race of Ryan White Program clients, slightly over-represented among females and persons 35-64 years old.
- Over half the CSS client base is working full-time (36%) or part-time (20%), potentially complicating service delivery.
- Preferred language is English for 39% of CSS sample, 43% Spanish, 8% Creole, very close to Ryan White Program demographics of clients in care. "Language barrier preventing service" was not an issue for clients in survey.
- Overall satisfaction with MCM services is very high, even during pandemic, with over 80% "very satisfied."







More Client Satisfaction Survey (CSS) findings ...

- Satisfaction is lower for outpatient/ambulatory health services (72% very satisfied), consistent with previous years, and weaker for Part A/ADAP pharmacy services (61%) and oral health care (56%).
- Adherence counseling is an issue: while majority of MCM and OAHS clients cite frequent encouragement to keep appointments and take medications, many clients do not find the information clear and easy to understand. This varies considerably from one subrecipient to another.
- Satisfaction levels are low when it comes to the lagtime in (1) getting a "new or next" MCM, OAHS or OHC appointment (especially OHC); (2) with getting through to MCM and OAHS providers on the phone; or (3) getting a call back from MCM or OAHS providers, although COVID-19 service disruptions did not reduce overall satisfaction below 2019-2020 levels.
