
Five QI Questions

1) Which priority population(s) has your QI team identified?

- Black African American Males (BAA Male Hetero and BAA MMSC)
- 2) Is this priority population specific to a location?
 - Yes. AHF Jackson North.
- 3) Which Root Cause Analysis (RCA) tool did you use to identify the contributing factors that may have caused non-viral load suppression?
 - Fishbone Diagram.

4) List the possible causes (from the RCA) that contribute to clients not being virally suppressed.

- Consumers who have recently been diagnosed and still have high viral loads
- Not retaining consumers in care
- Unstable housing
- Consumers that struggle with transportation
- Failure to adhere to medication
- high-risk lifestyles
- Substance use and mental illness.
- Racism in the healthcare system


