

Borinquen Medical Centers
 Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) Project—Integration of Primary Care and Mental Health Services

MAI Definition:

- Patient must be HIV positive
- Identify as a man who has sex with men (MSM) Black or Hispanic
- Heterosexual Black male and female

Purpose:

Patients with HIV have a higher likelihood of mental health comorbidity. At Borinquen Medical Centers, patients have access to a service that promotes opportunity to care, decreases stigma when needing specialty care, and improves outcomes by delivering a comprehensive health approach. Tom Schlepko, a dually certified advanced registered nurse practitioner, joined the Borinquen team in March 2021. Tom can provide primary care and mental health services to patients with HIV at the same visit, working to ensure patients receive the medical attention they may have historically declined or not had access to.

EUCHC MAI Initiative Baseline Data

- Baseline Viral Suppression for African American heterosexual males = 80.6%
- Baseline Viral Suppression for African American heterosexual females = 65%
- Baseline Viral Suppression for African American MSM = 87.1%
- Baseline No-show rate for MCM = 20%

COLUMN 1: CIS number

COLUMN 2: enter number corresponding to the demographic identifier

1. Hispanic male MMSC above the age of 19 years
2. African-American/Haitian male heterosexual
3. African-American/Haitian male MMSC
4. African-American/Haitian female

COLUMN 3: enter number corresponding to the risk factor

1. IDU
2. Substance use other than IDU
3. STI

COLUMN 4: date of enrollment in MAI project

COLUMN 5: viral load date and amount as of date of enrollment (if available; may be entered after lab results obtained)

COLUMN 6: first viral load drawn (date and #) after MAI enrollment

COLUMN 7: second viral load drawn (date and #) after MAI enrollment

COLUMN 8: last medical appointment prior to MAI enrollment

COLUMN 9: 1st kept medical appointment after MAI enrollment

COLUMN 10: 2ND kept medical appointment after MAI enrollment (as per retention criteria)
