Who Are We?: The Miami Speakers' Bureau

- The Miami Speakers' Bureau is a Florida Department of Health initiative that brings together individuals living with HIV to use their voice as a tool to end stigma in our communities
- The Miami Speakers' Bureau should aim to create role model stories based on personal accounts from individuals in our community
- These stories will be used to educate individuals on HIV adherence through evidence –based HIV prevention interventions and help them to put these lessons into everyday practice:
- Outcome goals can range: Individuals may..
 - Hear your story and find better ways to ensure that they are taking their medication everyday
 - Feel comfortable with disclosing their status
 - Join the Speakers' Bureau to share their stories also

Why Should You Tell Your Story?

- Throughout your life, what did you hear about HIV?
- Were you taught to be quiet about your status?
- $\circ~$ Did you feel supported by the collective?

The Four Truths of Being a Storyteller:



The Leader as a StoryTeller

Misconception #1: Telling the story for entertainment:

Although storytelling is a powerful tool to achieve results, the emphasis should not be placed on entertaining but maintaining your truth.

Misconception #2: Storytelling should not interfere with authenticity

Great storytelling does not conflict with truth; it is built on the integrity of the story and its teller

The Authenticity of Storytelling

Be true to yourself!

Storytelling requires showing and sharing emotion. HIV is a sensitive topic and sharing your story may make you feel emotional or more vulnerable than usual, which at times may not be easy.

Your story may expose your fears, anxieties, and more. The purpose is to allow your audience to identify with you and bring them to a point of understanding as well

- We also want to emphasize the importance of adherence!
 - Share the struggles you had in the beginning such as difficulty taking medication everyday, having to be aware of your status, and more!

Truth to the Audience

You will never fully know what your listener's are thinking, and you may say something that resonates with them, and you may not! The best thing you can do is to try to diversify and share your story with people outside of your niche!

Follow your instinct of who may be a good listener, and take their feedback

How your audience responds to the story is also a part of the storytelling experience

Remember that it is not about being entertaining, but make sure your audience is at least listening and taking it in.

The Moment's Truth

The story is not a script!

Think about how when you retell a story, do you tell it the same way each time? No! Tailor it to the situation

 $\,\circ\,$ The context of the story is a part of the story itself

Your story should capture the mission:

- To enhance behavioral change in our community
- ➢ Destigmatize HIV
- Encourage others to take power in their status: undetectable=untransmissible!


