PROGRAM MISSION

Community Rightful Center, Inc., Transitional Housing Employment Program mission is to enhance the lives of individuals with disabilities, underserved population and the socio-economically disenfranchised clients and their families through universal access to healthcare, case management, social, and employment services. CRC THEP seeks to provide services that encompass the “whole man” cultivating and rejuvenating the physical, mental, and emotional aspects of each individual we serve and to increase PLWH’s capacity to achieve housing stability. The Program also provides links to all possible care to clients to encourage and ensure positive growth and accountability, which will result in a healthier community.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Community Rightful Center Transitional Housing Employment Program provides referred clients the means to acquire necessary life skills through social skills training, coaching, mentoring and one to one supportive guidance so that they might successfully live a self-sufficient, productive personal and social life. The Transitional Housing Employment Program targets clients who are classified as PLWH and their case plans indicate a need for living independently, housing stability, or in some instance brokered transition. Employability skills training, vocational preparation, life skills training and successful employment services are combined to develop an individualized plan for the referred client. The program has a capacity of 24 Beds and is designed for male and female clients in gender specific settings. All services are provided in a structured home setting that utilizes a supportive transitional housing approach. The goal of the program is to empower each client to become a self-sufficient, healthy, positive and productive member of the community.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Clients must be HIV Positive or have AIDS, have a medical case manager and be able to function on his or own without any assistance.

REFERRAL PROCESS

- Referrals are accepted from the prospective applicant's medical case manager. If the prospective applicant does not have a medical case manager he/she will be referred to the agency of their choice.
