Update! Florida HIV Needs Assessment

Due date extended to March 31!

The Florida Comprehensive Planning Network (FCPN) and Florida Department of Health are conducting their annual Needs Assessment to ensure that the needs of people with HIV who reside in Florida are heard by the stakeholders who can help address those needs. Results will be shared with each jurisdiction. Please help get the word out so we can have a high response from Miami-Dade!

University of Miami Studies

- ◇ MACS/WIHS Combined Cohort Study A research study addressing the effects of HIV on the physical, emotional, and social health of adults in the US. Eligible participants may be compensated up to \$187
- ◇ The WHIMS Study Looking for women, between 18-45 years old and sexually active. Eligible participants are compensated up to \$100 per visit.
- ◇ Miami COVID Cohort. All participants will receive compensation.
- ◇ STAR: Study of Treatment and Reproductive Outcomes Women who are 18-45 years old and sexually active may be eligible. Women with HIV are eligible. Compensation up to \$130 per year.
