## **Ending the HIV Epidemic A Plan for Miami-Dade County**

The *Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America* was announced in February of this year. The new initiative seeks to reduce the number of new HIV infections in the United States by 75 percent within five years, and then by at least 90 percent within 10 years.

## **Key Strategies of the Plan**



**Diagnose** all people with HIV as early as possible after infection.

**Treat** the infection rapidly and effectively to achieve sustained viral suppression.





**Protect** people at risk for HIV using potent and proven prevention interventions, including PrEP, a medication that can prevent HIV infections.

**Respond** rapidly to detect and respond to growing HIV clusters and prevent new HIV infections.





**HIV HealthForce** will establish local teams committed to the success of the Initiative in each jurisdiction.

The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is finalizing the Ending the HIV Epidemic plan, that will provide guidance on innovative efforts to reduce the incidence of HIV. Community input is key in order to create a successful plan that is inclusive of the needs of everyone living in Miami-Dade County.
