- The PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) Workgroup had not met at the time of this meeting; a report on the PrEP Workgroup will be on next month's agenda.
- It would be helpful to know the qualifications for workgroup membership in order to assign the best person(s) to participate.
- There were some questions about upcoming meeting dates; the dates will be reviewed and sent to members, including which meetings are held in-person and which are held virtually.
- HIV/STI testing is not a component of all events. Data on events including testing can be compiled for a future meeting.
- Members would like to hear the Mpox presentation by Dr. Alvaro Mejia-Echeverry, Nursing Program Specialist at FDOH referenced in the Miami Collaborative MSM Workgroup presentation.
- Members would like to hear a presentation on STIs in relation to HIV diagnoses.
- Attendees discuss why low rates of HIV and AIDS diagnoses among youth (ages 13-19) shown in the epidemiology data should be treated with caution. Due to restrictions on HIV prevention education in middle school and high school aged youth, dates of acquiring HIV are believed to be severely underreported. There is a noticeable jump in case identification when persons age into the 20-29 year old category of tracking new cases. Several people shared anecdotal examples of the negative impacts the lack of access to youth HIV prevention and testing is having in the county.

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# Miami-Dade County PrEP Workgroup: A Summary

# The PrEP Workgroup: Purpose

- The Miami PrEP Workgroup is a platform for community advocates and providers to collaborate and use capacity building to create a local service model for PrEP/nPEP in Miami-Dade County. The group focuses on building relationships among providers and increasing uptake for the appropriate clients.
- The initiative has focused on strategic planning, capacity building, resource sharing, and opportunities for networking. Workgroup members collaborated to provide input on a local PrEP/nPEP strategic plan, gather community feedback, and utilize each other as a support system when implementing nPEP/PrEP services. The Workgroup demonstrates how one local area is coming together for community engagement that has created a local service model yielding outcomes that have generated opportunities for the community to access PrEP and increase uptake.
- The PrEP Workgroup meets every other month, 2:00-4:00pm on the last Wednesday of the month, starting in January.



# The PrEP Workgroup: Outline

- Every Miami PrEP Workgroup has the following outline...
  - Introductions: Members introduce who they are, what organization they are representing, and a little bit about themselves and their roles.
  - Committee Business:
    - During this time, there will be anywhere between 1 – 3 presenters, who will present on various subjects related to PrEP. This is generally where the workgroup performs its most essential function, which is to give general assistance, education/instruction, and facilitate conversation on all matters related to PrEP uptake and retention in Miami-Dade County. Examples will be given in later slides and include research updates, insurance barriers and access updates, updates on the Integrated Plan, and more.
    - After presentations are completed, presenters often have the opportunity to take questions and converse directly with workgroup members.
    - Committee business includes updates and communication on upcoming HIV/AIDS related days of awareness. Information is gathered during this time on what their respective organizations are doing to celebrate. Examples include...
      - April 10<sup>th</sup>: National Youth HIV and AIDS Awareness Day
      - April 18<sup>th</sup>: National Transgender HIV Testing Day
  - Partner Updates and Adjournment



# PrEP Workgroup: Main Topic 2022



- On December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 the FDA approved its first injectable treatment for HIV pre-exposure prevention.
- Despite this, injectable PrEP remained largely out of reach for most. Few insurances covered it and those which did required a lengthy and complicated process for a patient to be given access.
- Clinics and CBO's sought resources to try and gain access. The workgroup became a useful part of their repertoire in tackling this issue.
- Led by our community chair at the time, Paul Seligmann, numerous discussions were had with workgroup members regarding their greatest issues and hurdles. Presenters were sought across the spectrum in order to address them.

# PrEP Workgroup: Current Initiatives

- The PrEP Workgroup is currently engaged in 2 initiatives. One is community driven while the other is DOH driven
  - The community driven initiative is focused on continued PrEP uptake expansion through continued education on PrEP enrollment steps, insurance options, and grant options.
  - The DOH driven initiative is focused on improving the accuracy of our PrEP usage statistics in Miami-Dade County. At the moment, DOH Miami-Dade only has information on PrEP referrals from community partners. Little data exists on PrEP prescribed from other sources, nor is there much reliable data on the genuine number of people actively taking PrEP. Some preliminary conversations on the implementation of a universal electronic system of referrals is taking place to tackle this issue.

# Shigella Infection Among Gay, Bisexual, and Other Men Who Have Sex with Men

**Gay and bisexual men are a group at high risk for *Shigella* infection.**

## Shigella Can Spread Easily and Rapidly During Sexual Activity

*Shigella* passes from the poop (stool) or unclean fingers of one person to the mouth of another person. This can happen during sexual activity through:

- **Direct sexual contact:** Oral or anal sex, or anal play (rimming, fingering)
- **Indirect sexual contact:** Handling contaminated objects, such as sex toys, used condoms or barriers, and douching materials

Symptoms usually start 1–2 days after swallowing the germs and include **bloody diarrhea**, **fever**, and **stomach pain**. Talk with your doctor about *Shigella* if you have any of these symptoms and feel very sick.

**Multidrug-resistant *Shigella* infections have been on the rise in the U.S. since 2013.**

These types of infections are difficult to treat because germs develop the ability to defeat the drugs designed to kill them. That means *Shigella* germs are not killed and continue to grow.



## Protect Yourself and Your Partner



**Wash hands, genitals, and anus before and after sex.**



**Do not have sex if you have diarrhea.**



**Use condoms or dental dams during anal sex and oral sex.**

### Diagnosed with *Shigella* infection? Prevent spreading it to others:

- Wash your hands often, especially before eating or preparing food and after using the bathroom.
- Do NOT have sex until at least 2 weeks after your diarrhea ends.
- Do NOT prepare food for others while you are sick.
- Do NOT swim.
- If you work in healthcare, food service, or childcare, stay home until your health department says it's safe to return.

If you have a *Shigella* infection, drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration. Do not take anti-diarrheal medicine, as it can make symptoms worse. If your doctor prescribes antibiotics, take them exactly as directed and finish taking all the pills even if you feel better.

## **ALERT: THE NEED TO SCREEN FOR SYPHILIS AND OTHER SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS (STIs) DURING PREGNANCY**

Dear Colleague:

Florida's congenital syphilis case reports increased 82 percent from 99 to 180 cases between 2017 and 2021. Reported cases of accompanying adult syphilis have risen dramatically as well, from 8,954 cases in 2017, to 16,438 in 2021, an 83 percent increase. This increase is especially concerning for females of childbearing age which is up 63 percent. These trends have led to more adverse impacts among infants born to untreated mothers, including 72 syphilitic stillbirths and infant deaths between 2017 and 2021.

Up to 40 percent of babies born to mothers with untreated syphilis may be stillborn or die from the infection as a newborn.<sup>1</sup> Infants with syphilis can have seizures, infections, deformed bones, anemia, enlarged liver and spleen, jaundice, blindness and hearing impairment in their first few weeks.

Given these concerns, the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecologists recommends providers screen all pregnant women for syphilis, HIV, gonorrhea, chlamydia, and hepatitis B at their first and third trimester visit, and at delivery. Florida Administrative Code rule 64D-3 ([www.flrules.us/fac/64d-3.042/](http://www.flrules.us/fac/64d-3.042/)) includes the following expectation for all licensed Florida health care providers:

Practitioners attending a woman for prenatal care shall cause the woman to be tested for chlamydia, gonorrhea, hepatitis B, HIV and syphilis as follows:

1. At initial examination related to her current pregnancy; and again
2. At 28 to 32 weeks gestation; and again
3. At delivery for those with no prenatal care, no history of testing during pregnancy, or no record of testing after the 27<sup>th</sup> week of gestation.
4. Women who had a reactive serologic test for syphilis during pregnancy, regardless of subsequent tests that were non-reactive shall be tested at or following delivery.

Health care providers are critical to identifying and reducing maternal STIs by offering routine screening and timely treatment for all pregnant females as necessary. Clinicians are urged to be on heightened alert and screen all patients for syphilis and other STIs if there is an indication of symptoms or high-risk behavior.
