I. Call to Order

Committee Chair, David Goldberg, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. Introductions

Members, guests, and staff introduced themselves.

III. Housekeeping/Meeting Rules

Mr. Goldberg reviewed the PowerPoint, *Meeting Housekeeping*, which includes general reminders, code of conduct, people-first language, and meeting participation best practices.

IV. Floor Open to the Public

Mr. Goldberg opened the floor to the public with the following statement:

Pursuant to Florida Sunshine Law, I want to provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to be heard on any item on our agenda today. If there is anyone who wishes to be heard, I invite you to speak now. Each person will be given three minutes to speak. There were no comments; the floor was closed for public comment.

V. Review/Approve Agenda

Mr. Goldberg asked members to review the agenda. There were no changes.

VI. Review and Approve Minutes of May 9, 2023

Members reviewed the minutes of May 9, 2023. Staff noted the minutes distributed did not include the attachments but the complete minutes with attachments were posted prior to the meeting. There were no changes to the minutes.

VII. Reports

Membership

Staff announced that Amaris Hess has resigned from the committee due to her term ending, and Roselaine Monestime has resigned since she has is no longer working in the HIV field. Thank You cards for both members were circulated for attendee's signatures.

Staff noted there are now seven committee vacancies and at least five should be filled by members of the affected community. There are also significant vacancies on the Partnership and a simplified application process has been established to help with membership.

Partnership Report to Committees

Mr. Goldberg read the May 2023 Partnership meeting highlights into the record. The complete motions report is posted for review.

VIII. Standing Business

Review 2022 Annual Report Draft Revisions

Members reviewed the revised 2022 Annual Report and suggested the below updates, which will be incorporated into the draft presented in August.

- □ URLs on each page will be moved to the final page of resources.
- □ Spell out Ryan White Program once and use RWP throughout thereafter.
- □ State of the Epidemic: Include total population counts; remove "Cisgender".
- Geographic Trends: Make map bigger; remove watermark at bottom of image; make text within the red fields bolder. Members discussed indicting unhoused persons and decided it would be addressed on the Special Concerns page.
- Modes of Acquiring HIV: Change subtitle to clarify reporting is for clients active in FY 2022; spell out first instance of IDU; include MMSC abbreviation.
- □ Populations of Special Concern: Change referenced number from 8,599 to 8,590 to be consistent with HRSA reporting; change color of People Aging numbers from red to a more "positive" color; change; include Area Median Income in rental reference.
- ☐ Miami-Dade County Response (1): Reformat National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHAS) and Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) to their own individual pages and include more Miami-Dade County-

- specific details; for EHE, indicate "Available Now" and "Coming Soon;" correct Integrated Plan title link; include Miami's Integrated Plan as the graphic.
- ☐ Miami-Dade County Response (2): Add the collaborative partners details to the Integrated Plan page; expand Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) details to support Status Neutral graphic.
- ☐ Miami-Dade County Successes (1): Correct definitions of HIV in Care and Retained in Care.
- ☐ Miami-Dade County Successes (2): Expand on Frontlines of Communities in the United States (FOCUS); make data within the graphic part of text; include link to more than 180 testing sites; move Call to Action to last page.
- □ Your Role: Add action items like: Get tested; use people-first language; how to respond if someone tells you they are HIV positive; list resource links and footnote from page 1.

These updates were incorporated into the draft included as pages 4-13 of these minutes.

IX. New Business

There was no New Business.

X. Open Discussion and Announcements

The next Prevention Committee meeting will include a special presentation on HIV and STDs.

The Partnership was approved to be collaborating partners with the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC) on the National Dialogue on Racism and HIV as a Public Health Crisis. The meeting will take place June 23, 2023 via Zoom.

A new bill, CS/CS/SB 1718 – Immigration, will be effective as of July 1, 2023. The bill requires hospitals to collect patient immigration data; patients may opt out without jeopardizing their care, but may not be aware of their rights and therefore may choose not to seek medical care at all out of fear for revealing their status. A campaign is in development to educate patients on their rights under the new law.

XI. Next Meetings

Mr. Goldberg announced the next Strategic Planning Committee meeting is August 11, 2023. Members were offered the option to meet at Behavioral Science Research Corp., and were in favor of moving the next meeting to that location.

XII. Adjournment

Mr. Goldberg adjourned the meeting at 11:32 a.m.







Members recognized outgoing Chair, Dennis Iadarola, and presented him with a plaque for his service.

Members recognized the passing of Frederick Downs, Jr., and agreed to submit a resolution to the Mayor (prepared by the Assistant County Attorney) to make a proclamation recognizing Mr. Downs' many years of service to the community.

Members heard regular reports and approved the following motions:

Care and Treatment Committee

- 1. Motion to reallocate FY 2023-24 (YR 33) Ryan White Part A Formula and Supplemental grant funding of \$1.179,244 to Food Bank.
- 2. Motion to allocate 100% of Ryan White Part A Carryover funding (\$723,098) to Food Bank.
- 3. Motion to reallocate FY 2023-24 (YR 33) Ryan White Part A Formula and Supplemental grant funding for total proposed allocations as follows: \$6,174,853 to Medical Case Management; \$14,555 to AIDS Pharmaceutical Assistance; \$8,503,003 to Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services; \$3,388,975 to Oral Health Care; \$345,700 to Health Insurance Services; \$107,844 to Mental Health Services; \$1,701,206 to Substance Abuse Residential; \$38,128 to Substance Abuse Outpatient; \$186,688 to Medical Transportation; \$230,896 to Outreach; and \$122,449 Other Professional Services (Legal).
- 4. Motion to reallocate FY 2023-24 (YR 33) MAI funding for total proposed allocations as follows: \$943,920 to Medical Case Management; and \$1,241,041 to Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services.
- 5. Motion to allocate MAI Carryover funds as follows: \$537,152 to Medical Case Management; and \$537,152 to Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services.

Florida continues to have the highest annual incidence of new HIV diagnoses in the United States.





People with HIV in Miami-Dade County by Zip Code of Residence, 2021





Ryan White Program Clients: Populations of Special Concern

8,590 people with HIV were served by the RWP in FY 2022. The 2022-2026 Miami-Dade County Integrated HIV/AIDS Prevention and Care Plan includes activities to ensure positive health outcomes for people aging with HIV and those who are unstably housed or experiencing homelessness.

People Aging with HIV

44%

of RWP clients in MDC were over age 50 and aging into Medicare in 2022.



The Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership

RWP Planning Council established by County Ordinance as the official County Advisory Board for HIV needs and services in MDC.

Providing coordination between people with HIV, including RWP clients, service providers, and administrators, FDOH-MDC, government officials, the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS Program (HOPWA), General Revenue, Medicare, Medicaid, universities, hospitals, and HIV advocates.

The Ryan White Program

Providing life-saving HIV medical care and treatment and support services to more than 8,500 people with HIV in 2022.

The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County

Local County Health Department (FDOH-MDC)

Providing HIV and sexually transmitted disease testing and prevention services with more than 116,000 HIV tests administered in 2022.

Miami-Dade County Response Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE)

Miami-Dade County is one of 57 priority jurisdictions receiving EHE funding for resources, technology, and expertise to expand HIV prevention and treatment activities. All residents - regardless of immigration status or income level - can benefit from these RWP and FDOH-MDC EHE services.

RWP EHE Initiatives

Available Now!

- HealthTec To enhance telehealth services.
- Quick Connect To expand the Test and Treat / Rapid Access (TTRA) protocol, ensuring access within 7 days to medical care and antiretroviral therapy (ART).

Coming Soon!

- Housing Stability Services Housing as Healthcare To provide transitional, short-term, or emergency housing assistance.
- Mobile GO Teams To support Miami-Dade County's ability to rapidly respond to HIV transmission clusters.

FDOH-MDC EHE Initiatives

Services are available through 12 local agencies, Jackson Memorial Hospital and Homestead Hospital.

- To provide rapid HIV testing and at-home HIV testing.
- To educate providers on the benefits of routinized opt-out HIV testing at hospitals and clinics.
- To ensure all persons who test positive for HIV will have medication to reach viral load suppression.
- To establish a network of referrals to connect persons with HIV to care and social services.
- To get people who have fallen out of care back into care.
- To provide partner services and Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP).
- To engage the community in HIV testing through social marketing and media campaigns throughout the county.



HIV Prevention Initiatives

Our goal: By December 2026, at least 90% of people with HIV living in Miami-Dade County will be aware of their HIV status.

Frontlines of Communities in the United States (FOCUS) and FDOH-MDC HIV Testing

FOCUS is a collaborative model for routine communicable disease screening that enables partners to develop and share best practices in routine HIV, HCV and HBV screening, diagnosis, and linkage to care.

HIV Test & Treat / Rapid Access Protocol (TTRA)

TTRA is the standard of care for every person newly diagnosed with HIV:

- Within 7 days: Receive counseling, evaluation, baseline laboratory tests, and start antiretroviral treatment.
- Within 14 days: Enroll in the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP).
- Within 30 days: Be linked to RWP Medical Case Management, Peer Support, substance abuse treatment, and mental health counseling as needed.

• TTRA Linkage (July 2018-May 2022)

- 558 new-to-HIV and new-to-Ryan White clients
- 101 returned-to-care clients

HIV Prevention Initiatives

HIV testing is available with on-site rapid testing, after-hours rapid testing, mobile rapid testing, opt-out testing in emergency rooms and clinics, and at-home testing.



PrEP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis)

A comprehensive HIV prevention strategy for HIV-negative individuals that involves the daily use of antiretroviral medications to reduce the risk of contracting HIV.

PEP (Post-Exposure Prophylaxis)

Taking antiretroviral medicines after being potentially exposed to HIV to prevent contracting HIV.

At Home Testing

Promoting HIV self-testing kits as an alternative option especially for hard-to-reach populations including youth, sex workers, and LGBTQ+ communities.

Condom Distribution


More than 1.9 million free condoms were distributed in 2021 with the help of a broad variety of community partners, including bars and clubs, colleges and schools, faith-based organizations, and street outreach.





HIV Treatment Successes

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the RWP maintained clients in care and kept them virally suppressed.



In HIV Care

 Having at least one medical visit, a CD4 test, or viral load test in a 12 month period.

Retained In Care

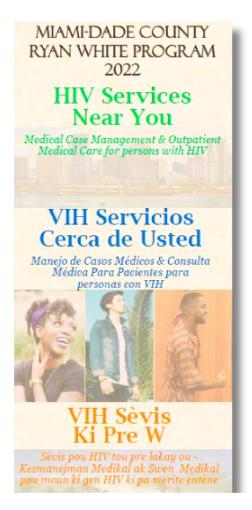
• Having two or more medical visits, CD4 tests, or viral load tests at least 3 months apart.

Virally Suppressed

 Having less than 200 copies of HIV per milliliter of blood, which is achieved by consistently taking HIV medicine.

HIV Treatment Successes

In 2022, the local RWP provided life-saving core and support services to 8,590 people with HIV in Miami-Dade County, up from 8,127 in 2020.

Infectious Disease Elimination Act

HIV transmission via injection drug use was mitigated by the Infectious Disease Elimination Act - IDEA Exchange, an innovative Syringe Services Program (SSP), which started in December 2016 in Miami-Dade County and has become a statewide SSP model.




No Babies Born with HIV

For the fourth year in a row, **no babies were born with HIV** to HIV positive mothers in Miami-Dade County, due in large part to the initiatives funded by the Ryan White Program Part D at University of Miami – Miller School of Medicine, Dept. of Obstetrics, Gynecology & Reproductive Sciences.

HIV Status Neutral Service Delivery Model

The MDC Integrated Plan includes activities to promote the CDC-recommended HIV Status Neutral Service Delivery Model, where HIV testing serves as an entry point to services regardless of a positive or negative result, to improve HIV prevention and care outcomes.



Everyone has a role in ending the HIV epidemic!



 Support funding for HIV initiatives of the Ryan White Program, Florida Department of Health, Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA), and Medicare.

 - o Please don't use stigmatizing terms such as "dirty, "clean," or "victim".
