Ryan White Program Part A/Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) as of March 12, 2024

1. Expenditures

- □ Part A: \$22,766,639 (including \$723,098 in carryover) available for Direct Client Services; \$18,723,212.58 (82.24%) paid to date à compared to 59.42% in expenditures reported last month.
- □ MAI: \$2,664,436 (including \$980,218 in carryover) available for Direct Client Services; \$1,500,382.77 (56.31%) paid to date à compared to 44.05% in expenditures reported last month.

2. 2. Service Utilization

- Unduplicated Clients: 8,934 served between March 2023 and January 2024 (We're almost back to serving 9,000+ clients, with 189 more clients than reported as served last month.)
 - 8,828 clients received **Part A** services.
 - 1.467 clients received MAI services.
- Most utilized services in January 2024, by unduplicated client count:
 - Part A: 4,269 clients Medical Case Management (MCM); 1,140 clients Outpatient/ Ambulatory Health Services (OAHS); 641 clients – Oral Health Care (OHC).
 - **MAI**: 500 clients MCM; 77 clients OAHS.

3. Administrative/Fiscal Updates

- □ All amendments were executed prior to the end of the grant year, February 29th.
- □ Recipient is currently in the year-end closeout process and reporting phase of FY 2023.
 - Final day for subrecipients to submit reimbursement requests (invoices) for FY 2023 is Monday, April 1, 2024.
- We are still awaiting the final report from HRSA for the recent Part A/MAI Site Visit.

General Revenue at SFAN

- 1. January 2024: We provided services to a total of 470 unduplicated clients under General Revenue. We are currently full in our beds with the Salvation Army; a waiting list has been implemented as there is an increase in utilization for this service. We continue to provide services under our support services for Home Health Care.
- 2. December 2023: A total of 564 clients received services; 200 received medical case management and 87 received Outpatient services. Our Salvation Army beds are full and continue to have a waiting list.
