

#### Officer Nominations for Calendar Year 2024

The Chair of the Prevention Committee is assigned by the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County. Abril Sarmiento will remain the Chair.

Nominations for Vice Chair were called for from the floor. Eddie Orozco volunteered to serve as Vice Chair. Elections will take place at the next scheduled meeting.

#### Florida Comprehensive Planning Network (FCPN) Activities

The FCPN presenter was not available therefore the update was postponed to a future meeting.

#### Miami-Dade County HIV Prevention Milestones and Success Stories

□ Hispanic Initiative (Iniciativa Hispana)

Members have been meeting in person with online check-ins. They participated in and attended several recent HIV/AIDS Awareness Day events for National Latinx AIDS Awareness Day (NLAAD) and National Faith HIV/AIDS Awareness Day. Members discussed strategies for having greater participation in next year's NLAAD events. Members are working with NMAC to bring the ESCALATE – Ending Stigma Through Collaboration and Lifting All to Empowerment – training program to Miami.

□ The Miami Collaborative MSM Workgroup and Transgender Tenacity Power

The groups are meeting together. In October, members heard presentations on *Conexiones*, a new National HIV Behavioral Surveillance (NHBS) MSM Chemsex Study, by Dr. Gladys Ibañez from FIU; and DoxyPEP, by Kamelah Jones from FDOH. Members discussed the Miami-Dade Schools SAFE Network and both current and ongoing legislation.

□ Youth Health Workgroup

Discussions continue about how to provide HIV testing at schools in Miami-Dade County. Additional reporting will be available at the next meeting.

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis Workgroup

The group met in November and had good attendance from 11 different agencies. Members discussed World AIDS Day planning and heard a presentation from Carolina Alcala from Gilead on Descovy and PrEP usage in the USA. The group is also focusing on other topics, including PrEP research and PrEP on demand research, e-tracking PrEP usage in Miami-Dade County, PrEP as part of primary care, and overcoming insurance barriers.

#### X. Announcements and Open Discussion

World AIDS Day events were announced at Pridelines; Project Access Foundation; and by FDOH in collaboration with their Ending the HIV Epidemic Health Fair.

#### XI. <u>Next Meeting</u>

Dr. Mooss announced the December 2023 meeting is cancelled and the next meeting is scheduled for January 25, 2024, at the Miami-Dade County Main Library.

#### XII. Adjournment

Ms. Sarmiento thanked everyone for attending and adjourned the meeting at 10:42 a.m.



Commemorated National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day with an Outreach and Testing event on Tuesday, February 6<sup>th</sup>. The Take the Train...Take the Test event was held at Culmer, Allapattah, Brownsville Metrorail stations. Feedback from the participants and providers were that it was very successful and we hope to continue this initiative throughout the year. The outcomes for the event were:

- Distributed 1,300 total condoms
- Total of 32 total individuals tested for HIV; 1 reactive
- Total of 11 PrEP referrals were provided

The Miami PrEP Workgroup meeting is a platform for community advocates and providers to collaborate and use capacity building to create a local service model for PrEP/nPEP in Miami-Dade County. This group focuses on building relationships among providers and increasing uptake for the appropriate clients. During the last two years, this initiative has focused on strategic planning, capacity building, resource sharing, and opportunities for networking. The members collaborate to provide input on a local PrEP/nPEP strategic plan, gather community feedback with forums and town halls, and utilize each other as a support system when implementing nPEP/PrEP services. The utilization of a workgroup demonstrates how one local area is coming together for community engagement that has created a local service model yielding outcomes that have generated opportunities for the community to access PrEP and increase uptake.

The term **INCOME** shall include, but is not limited to, the following items: wages, salaries; tips; bonuses; commissions & fees; dividends, interest; profits from businesses and professions; your share of profits from partnerships and small business corporations; pensions, annuities & endowments; profits from the sale or exchange of real estate, securities or other property, including personal residence; rents and royalties; your share or estate or trust income, including accumulated distributions; alimony, separate maintenance or support payments; prizes, awards and gifts; fees as an Executor, Administrator or Director; disability retirement payments; workmen's compensation, insurance; damages; social security payments, etc.

#### **FILING INSTRUCTIONS**

A "Source of Income Form," (SOI) or a signed copy of the personal income tax forms may be filed to satisfy the filing requirement for County/Public Health Trust employees, municipal employees, advisory board members, and consultants providing professional services to the County or a Municipality who are not required to file under State law. State filers who also hold County or Municipal positions (for example, State filers who also serve on County or Municipal boards) meet the County financial disclosure requirement by filing a **copy** of their state form with the Miami-Dade County Elections Department or their Municipal clerk.

The Source of income Form must be filed yearly no later than 12:00 noon of July 1st. Consultants file within thirty (30) days of execution of a contract arising out of competitive negotiations and prior to any payments from the County, municipalities or other agencies and thereafter on a yearly basis no later than 12:00 noon of July 1st. For the last year of service, file "Final Source of Income Form "(SOI-F). The SOI and SOI-F should not be used as a substitute for State Form 1 or State Form 1F for those required to file under state requirements.

Filers whose address is exempt pursuant to Fla. Stat. §119.07 must provide an alternate address such as a business address or the address of the board if the filer serves on a board.

This form must be filed by July 1st of each year and should not be used as a substitute for State Form 1 for those required to file under state requirements. For the last year of service, file SOI-F.

The following persons are exempt from disclosing their home addresses: active or former law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; firefighters; justices and judges; current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; county and municipal code inspectors and code enforcement officers.
