The Partnership

The Miami-Dade HIV/AIDS Partnership

A Miami-Dade County advisory board and the official Ryan White Program (RWP) planning council for HIV medical care and support services.

- Also called:
 - The Partnership
 - The Board
 - The Planning Council or PC
 - The HIV Planning Council or HIVPC
 - MDHAP
- Comprised of The Partnership; 6 standing committees;
 1 subcommittee (SC); and 1 work group (WG).
- Meetings require a Quorum of members: The minimum number of members required to make the meeting valid.
- That's why it's so important to RSVP:
 - Members should always respond "Yes" or "No".
 - Guests should respond if they are attending.



Partnership Lingo

BSR

Behavioral Science Research Corp. The contracted RWP subrecipient which provides staff support to the Partnership and provides Clinical Quality Management personnel for the CQM Program.

CQM

Clinical Quality Management. BSR staffs the MAI CQM Team and the CQM Committee.

AIDSNET.org

The website for the Partnership, CQM, and Community Newsletter. Location of calendars, meeting documents, membership applications, community news, and more!

PE-Miami

Provide® Enterprise Miami. Data management system utilized by RWP Part A and Part B in Miami-Dade County.

The Recipient

The Miami-Dade County Office of Management and Budget - Grants Coordination/Ryan White Program, also called:

- OMB
- □ OMB-GC
- □ The County

 OMB receives Ryan White Program Part A/MAI funds from HRSA.

Recipient Lingo Basics

HRSA

The Health Resources and Services Administration: The source of federal Ryan White Program grant funds.

Part A

Ryan White Program funds granted to EMAs.

EMA

Eligible Metropolitan Area: Area with at least 2,000 AIDS cases in the last 5 years and a in population of at least 50,000.

MAI

The Minority AIDS Initiative: Additional RWP funding to improve access to HIV care and health outcomes for disproportionately affected racial and ethnic minority populations.

Subrecipients or service providers

Organizations under contract with OMB that provide Part A/MAI-funded medical and support services.



Recipient Lingo Funding

Formula Funds

Amount of RWP Part A/MAI funds based on the number of people living with HIV in the EMA.

Supplemental Funds

Amount of additional RWP Part A/MAI funds based on our competitive grant.

Carryover Funds

Amount of funds not spent in the past year which HRSA agrees to let us spend in the current year.

Unobligated Funds

Amount of funds which have not been assigned to a RWP Part A/MAI subrecipient/category.





Recipient Lingo Expenditures

Fiscal Year (FY)

For Part A/MAI, this is the period from March 1 of one year through the end of February of the following year.

Allocation

The amount of money the Partnership agrees should be spent in each *service category* each fiscal year.

Direct Services Funds

The amount of funds to be spent on core medical and support services.

FPL

The Federal Poverty Level. The FPL is used to determine RWP eligibility and benefits.

Grantee Reports FDOH

FDOH-MDC or FDOH

The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County. This is our *local* health department.



Funds Ryan White allowable medical and support services to improve HIV health care for clients.



ADAP

The AIDS Drug Assistance Program: Provides FDAapproved medications for low-income individuals with HIV who have limited or no coverage from private insurance or Medicaid, and insurance coverage for uninsured RWP clients.



More Grantee Reports!

GR

General Revenue funds which are state funds designated for care and treatment services for people with HIV.

HOPWA

(currently HOTMA) Housing Opportunity Through Modernization Act Program. A federal program that provides funding to support housing and housing-related services for people with AIDS and their families. Related terms include:

- □ STRMU: Short-Term Rental, Mortgage and Utilities Assistance;
- Project-based: Funds designated units in a building;
- □ LTRA: Long-Term Rental Assistance (a voucher program); and
- □ FMR: Fair Market Rents



Community Coalition Roundtable

The Community Coalition Roundtable
 A standing committee of the Partnership.

Appointments

Partnership members are appointed by the Mayor of Miami-Dade County.

Members of the Affected Community People with HIV who receive Part A/MAI services and are not affiliated with or employed by a Part A funded subrecipient.

People First Language
 Terminology used to recognize people as people, not as a condition.



Care and Treatment Committee

■ The Care and Treatment Committee (C&T)
A standing committee of the Partnership.

■ MCSC

Medical Care Subcommittee. Reports to the C&T.

FCPN

Florida Comprehensive Planning Network. A statewide planning group whose representatives include members of the Care and Treatment and Prevention Committees.



Needs Assessment

NA

Annual Needs Assessment. A comprehensive review of data used to make recommendations for PSRA.

PSRA

Priority Setting and Resource Allocation

□ Priority Setting (PS)

The process of establishing priorities among allowable service categories to meet locally identified needs.

□ Resource Allocation (RA)

The dollar amounts or percentages calculated to fund each RWP service category.



Needs Assessment Data

Epi Data

Epidemiological data. The number and characteristics (e.g., age, gender) of a group of people.

□ Incidence

The number of *new cases* of a disease in a population during a defined time period.

□ Prevalence

The *total number* of people in a defined population with a specific disease or condition at a given time.

Demographics

Statistical data relating to the population and particular groups within it.

Utilization

A measure of expenditures and units of service across service categories.



Additional Needs Assessment Data!

Continuum of Care

Model outlining the stages from diagnosis of HIV to viral load suppression: Diagnosis → Linkage to care → In medical care → Retained in medical care → Virally suppressed

COC

Co-occurring condition(s). Any number of medical and socioeconomic conditions co-existing with HIV.

VL

Viral load. The measure of HIV per milliliter (ml) of blood. VL suppression is defined as less than 200 copies of HIV per ml of blood.

RIC or RIC Rates

Retention in HIV care or retention in HIV care rates.

EIIHA

Early Identification of Individuals with HIV/AIDS. Locally, EIIHA is an annual measure of HIV testing events and linkage to care.



Core Services

Core Medical Services or Core Services Essential, direct, health care services for HIV care as specified in the Ryan White legislation.

Part A/MAI Core Services funded in our EMA

- OAHS: Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services (doctors)
- MH: Mental Health Therapy/Counseling (mental health visits with a therapist)
- MCM: Medical Case Management (assistance with navigating health care)
- SA-OP: Substance Abuse-Outpatient (overcoming substance use in an outpatient setting)

Part A Core Services funded in our EMA

- APA: AIDS Pharmaceutical Assistance (prescription drugs)
- OHC: Oral Health Care (dental)
- □ HIP/CSA: Health Insurance Services (health insurance wrap around services)



Support Services

Support Services

Services needed to achieve medical outcomes that affect the HIV-related clinical status of a person with HIV.

Part A/MAI Support Services funded in our EMA

- MT: Medical Transportation (bus/Metrorail services to get to health-related appointments)
- OR: Outreach services (assist in returning clients to care)
- EFA: Emergency Financial Assistance (restricted to assisting with prescriptions provided for TTRA [Test and Treat Rapid Access])

Part A Core Services funded in our EMA

- □ FB: Food Bank (bag of food)
- LS: Other Professional Services-Legal and Permanency planning (legal assistance for HIV related issues)
- SA-Res: Substance Abuse-Residential (overcoming substance use in a residential facility)




Prevention Committee

Prevention Committee

A standing committee of the Partnership and cocommittee with Strategic Planning of the Joint Integrated Plan Review Team.

FDOH Prevention Mobilization Workgroups
 Targeted community groups promoting HIV and STI testing and education.





Prevention Committee Lingo

PrEP

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis. A comprehensive HIV prevention strategy that involves the daily use of ARTs to reduce the risk of HIV in HIV-negative individuals.

TTRA

Test and Treat/Rapid Access. Protocol designed to ensure newly diagnosed people or those returning to care will obtain immediate linkage to medical care and treatment.

STD or STI
 Sexually transmitted disease or sexually transmitted infection.

MMSC and MSM

Male-to-male sexual contact (refers to HIV mode of transmission) and Men who have sex with men (refers to people).

IDU and PWID
 Injection drug use and Person who injects drugs.



Strategic Planning Committee Lingo

Strategic Planning Committee

A standing committee of the Partnership and cocommittee with Prevention of the Joint Integrated Plan Review Team.

Annual Report

Annual snapshot of HIV in Miami-Dade County developed to educate government officials on the state of the epidemic.

 Assessment of the Recipient Administrative Mechanism

A HRSA-required evaluation of the Recipient's response to Partnership priorities, distribution of RWP funds, contract execution and performance.



JIPRT and IPEW

JIPRT

The Joint Integrated Plan Review Team. Strategic Planning Committee and Prevention Committee collaboration to oversee the development and implementation of the *2022-2026 Miami-Dade County HIV Integrated Prevention and Care Plan.*

IPEW

The Integrated Plan Evaluation Workgroup. A workgroup that reports to the JIPRT. Responsible for managing the implementation, measurement, and evaluation processes for the Integrated Plan, including tracking Plan progress to identify optimal performance and areas of improvement.



JIPRT and IPEW Lingo

IP or The Plan

2022-2026 Miami-Dade County HIV Integrated Prevention and Care Plan. A 5-year plan to fulfill the NHAS **goals** and address the EHE **pillars**.

NHAS

National HIV/AIDS Strategy. Four *goals*.

- 1. Prevent new HIV infections.
- Improve HIV-related health outcomes of people with HIV.
- 3. Reduce HIV-related disparities and health inequities.
- 4. Achieve integrated, coordinated efforts that address the HIV epidemic among all partners.

EHE

Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America. Four *pillars*.

- 1. Diagnose
- 2. Treat
- 3. Prevent
- 4. Respond
