• Are any programs open?

Both the Permanent Housing Placement Program that provides for Security Deposit and First or Last month of rent as well as other moving expenses and The Short-Term, Rental, Mortgage, and Utility (STRMU) are available. The STRMU provides for up to 21-weeks in any 52-week period with rental assistance. The current provider is Care Resouce.

• Is the City of Miami still investing with construction developers for set-aside units? If so, are there any?

The City of Miami is open to proposals for the development of affordable housing units earmarked for people with AIDS/HIV.

• Has the City of Miami acquired any new units? They had acquired some years ago in Homestead.

The City of Miami has not acquired any new HOPWA units. The City supports, three facilities under Project-Based for a total of 26 units.

• Is the City of Miami doing anything with Sugar Hill or church on 8th Street?

No.

• Is there any surplus in the HOPWA budget?

There is no surplus in the HOPWA budget. Funding is fully allocated yearly. There is a carryover balance that the City utilizes as a reserve to when the FMR increases. With this we hope we can afford any increases in rent amounts without having to stop servicing existing TBRA clients.
